Letter From Our Principal

Dear Acacia Families,

We are well on our way with STAR testing, and the children are doing such a great job of staying focused and conscientious. I am always so proud of them, and even more so as they approach testing with positive confidence and dedication.

With each school year, our students have increased opportunities in 21st century learning skills, increasing their learning experiences and building more independent confidence. So often 21st century learning is equated with technology. Technology is a large part of it, but it is how the technology is used that is most important. In Fullerton School District, and at Acacia School, technology is used for the four C's to: communicate; collaborate; create; and critically think. Even beyond technology, there is greater meaning to 21st century learning.

As I have looked at research, I have read profound words written by knowledgeable people about 21st century learning. As we continue to develop 21st century learning opportunities for our students, it is wonderful to learn and hold onto these important statements:

"Twenty-first-century learning means that students master content while producing, synthesizing, and evaluating information from a wide variety of subjects and sources with an understanding of and respect for diverse cultures. Students demonstrate the three Rs, but also the "four Cs": creativity, communication, (critically thinking), and collaboration. They demonstrate digital literacy as well as civic responsibility. Virtual tools and open-source software create borderless learning territories for students of all ages, anytime and anywhere."
